#### **Tanglewood Park Bird Habitat Program**

Making a Difference: 15-years of Tanglewood Park Bird Habitat Preservation

Back in 2010, Forsyth Audubon leaders had a vision to plant warm season native grasses in a Tanglewood Park meadow to improve habitat for Eastern Meadowlark and other grassland birds. Ron Morris, Carol Gearhart and other members met with the Forsyth County Parks and Recreation Department to discuss this vision and set the foundation for years of collaboration with the county that continues today. Our Tanglewood accomplishments have included planting and maintenance of the bird sanctuary meadow, creation of the Yadkin including removing invasive Black Locust trees from the meadow and supporting plans to improve trail accessibility.

#### **No Mow March**

What's Happening on the Advocacy Front?

The City of Winston Salem is working on a new conservation program that is growing in popularity around the southern portions of the country called "**No Mow March**". Everyone is encouraged to not mow in March, especially in areas where native vegetation would thrive if spared the blade. Special kudos to both the City and County for implementing this program in selected parks.

This is a great time for Audubon members to revisit their yards to see if they can replace sections of lawn with mulched areas and native plants.
