
Forsyth Audubon Monthly Chapter Meeting

Former Forsyth Audubon President Nathan Gatto will speak on "Pelagic Adventures Between the Gulf Stream and California Current"



Nathan Gatto, well-known and admired by many Forsyth area birders, has been interested in birds since the age of four. His birding addiction started by collecting bird feathers and trying to see new species at Miller Park. His first job was with the US Forest Service and the University of Georgia, conducting bird and flora surveys in the Nantahala district out of Coweeta station. Nathan enjoys all types of birding except for hawk watching! Currently, Nathan is working with his two daughters to foster the same love of nature while still chasing rare birds.
